Wed., Sept. 28

Teki'at Shofar – Hearing the Shofar Sounds

Hearing the sounds of the shofar on Rosh Hashanah is a mitzvah separate from the other mitzvot observed in the synagogue. Therefore, for a person unable to attend the synagogue, arrange for a shofar blowing at home or in another location so that the person can fulfill the mitzvah.

Preparing to Celebrate with a New Fruit or New Clothes

The 2nd day of the new year is celebrated in the evening with a “new” fruit (i.e., a seasonal fruit that you have not yet tasted this season) or with new clothes, worn for the first time that evening. In preparation, obtain the new fruit or new clothes before Rosh Hashanah begins.

On Rosh Hashanah or any Yom Tov falling on a weekday, cooking is permitted, but only to prepare food for that particular day. On Shabbat it is forbidden to cook. Therefore, preparing food for a Shabbat that follows a Yom Tov presents a difficulty. To allow cooking for Shabbat without violating the laws of Yom Tov, Jewish law sanctions a method of *combining* (ערוב) the cooking for Yom Tov and Shabbat. This procedure allows for cooking for Shabbat on a Friday Yom Tov by beginning the cooking *before* the beginning of Yom Tov and in anticipation of Shabbat. (The ברכה *berakhah* and accompanying declaration are found below and in most siddurim.)

1. Before Yom Tov begins, take two prepared foods, customarily a baked food (e.g., מצה *matsah*) and a cooked food (e.g., a hard-cooked egg or a piece of cooked chicken or fish).
2. Recite the ברכה *berakhah*: S306 F716

ברוך אתה יי, אלהינו מלך העולם, אשר קדשנו במצותיו
וצננו על מצות ערוב.

3. Recite a declaration *in a language you understand* that cooking for Shabbat was begun before, and will be completed on, Yom Tov. S306 F716

ולעשות כל צרכינו מיום טוב לשבת, לנו ולכל ישראל הדורים

By means of the mixture (*eruv*), we are permitted to bake, cook, warm,
kindle lights, and make all the necessary preparations for Shabbat
during the Festival (*yom tov*), we and all who live in this city/locale.

4. Set aside the two foods for eating on Shabbat day.

The cooking for Shabbat may now be completed on Yom Tov.

Preparation of a Flame for Rosh Hashanah or Yom Tov

Kindling a *new* fire is not permitted on Rosh Hashanah or Yom Tov; however, the use of an *existing* fire for cooking or other purposes is permitted.

To allow you to light candles for the second day of Rosh Hashanah or Yom Tov (Thursday evening), ensure you have a fire burning before the beginning of the first day (Wednesday before sunset) that will continue to burn at least until after dark on Thursday. For example:

- A burning candle that lasts for more than 25 hours
- A pilot light on a gas range (*not* a gas range with an electronic starter)

Candle Lighting for Rosh Hashanah or Yom Tov (Day 1)

1. Light the candles at least 18 minutes before sunset.
2. Recite 2 ברכות *berakhot*: S303 F718

After reciting המוציא, it is customary to dip pieces of bread in honey
(instead of the usual salt) and distribute them to those at the table.

After eating the bread:
 1. Dip a piece of apple in honey.
 2. Recite the ברכה *berakha* over tree fruit, ending בורא פרי העץ *bo-re peri ha'ets*. S336 F715
 3. Eat the honey-dipped piece of apple.
 4. Recite the prayer for a sweet year:
יהי רצון... ומתוקה. *Yehi ratson... umtukah*. S336 F750
- Festive singing *birkat hamazon* with Rosh Hashanah additions (see yellow box, p. 4)

Tashlikh

In the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah (if Shabbat, then the second day), it is customary to walk to a natural body of water for the תשליך *tashlikh* ceremony, which is based on the final three verses in the book of the prophet מִיכָהּ *Mikhah*. Symbolically, we cast our sins away, as if into the depths of the sea, and seek God's forgiveness. Many editions of the maḥzor include the text of the ceremony. If you are unable to accomplish this ritual on Rosh Hashanah, you can perform it until Hosh'a'na Rabbah, although before Yom Kippur is preferable.

Candle Lighting for Day 2 of Rosh Hashanah or Yom Tov

1. Do not light the candles until after dark, when the 1st day ends. Some wait until three stars appear, or at least 25 minutes after sunset, which is at least 43 minutes after the time set for lighting candles yesterday. Others wait longer; consult your rabbi for the proper waiting time in your community.
2. Do not *strike* a match. Instead, transfer fire to the candles from an *existing* flame (see p. 2) by inserting a match or other stick into the flame.
3. Do not *extinguish* the match or stick. Instead, deposit it on a non-flammable tray or dish, and let it self-extinguish. Alternately, a wood *safety* match held vertically (flame up) usually self-extinguishes quickly.
4. Recite 2 בְּרָכוֹת *berakhot* (see p. 3). S303 F718
5. To be ready to light candles for Shabbat, ensure that you have a fire burning that will continue to burn at least until sunset on Friday. If this necessitates lighting another long-burning candle, follow instructions 2 and 3 for transferring the flame.

Celebrating with a New Fruit or New Clothes

During candle lighting and Kiddush, have the new fruit on the dinner table or wear the new article of clothing (see p. 1). When you recite שְׂהֵפְיָנוּ Shehefeyanu, have in mind that you are saying it for the new fruit or clothes as well.

Observing Tsom Gedalyah

After Nebuchadnezzar razed Jerusalem in 586 B.C.E., he installed Gedalyah ben Aḥikam as governor of Judah, which had become a Babylonian province. A few years later a Jew was recruited to assassinate Gedalyah. With the death of the governor, the few Jews remaining in Jerusalem dispersed; the last vestiges of Jewish control over Jerusalem ended. Tsom Gedalyah commemorates these events.

The fast is delayed until 4 Tishrey because this year the usual date of the fast, 3 Tishrey, falls on Shabbat.

- This is a minor fast day, so called because the fast does not begin until dawn.
- The fast (from both eating and drinking) lasts until dark.
- The *sheliaḥ tsibbur*, the Torah reader, and those called for *aliyot* should be fasting.
- The preferred fast-day procedures apply when at least six of those who are counted for a minyan are fasting.
- If it is ascertained (without causing embarrassment) that fewer than six are fasting, follow the procedures printed in gray and marked with ✦.

The Rabbis considered it a mitsvah to eat a סְעוּדַת מַפְסֵקֶת *se'udah mafseket* (festive final meal) *before* Yom Kippur begins. If possible, attend Minḥah first, and then eat.

Memorial Candle

Before lighting the Shabbat and holiday candles:

If a parent or other close relative has died, light a memorial candle that will burn throughout Yom Kippur.

Observing Yom Kippur

The Torah (Vayikrah 23:32) refers to Yom Kippur as *שבת שבתון shabbat shabbaton* (a sabbath of complete rest). Thus, even if Yom Kippur does not fall on Shabbat, it takes on all the restrictions of a regular Shabbat. Unlike other Yom Tov days, cooking, use of fire, and carrying are not permitted.

In addition, the following are not permitted until dark after Yom Kippur:

- Eating and drinking
- Sexual relations
- Bathing or washing (except for minimal washing of hands to remove dirt or after using the bathroom)
- Using skin or bath oils
- Wearing leather shoes

It is customary to wear white. During services, some wear a *kittel* (plain white robe).

Before Kol Nidrey

1. Arrive at the synagogue before sunset, while it is still light.
2. Say the regular ברכה *berakhah* over a טלית *tallit*, S62 W2 F4 and put it on.

Building a Sukkah

Immediately after Yom Kippur ends (or as soon thereafter as possible), begin to build your סִכָּה *sukkah*—even if you can do only a small first step.

This is a concrete act symbolizing our firm commitment, expressed throughout Yom Kippur, to building mitsvot into our everyday lives.

- During the days leading up to Sukkot, complete the sukkah.
- It is considered an act of הַדְדוּר מִצְוָה *hiddur mitsvah* (beautification of the mitsvah) to build and decorate your סִכָּה in a manner that enhances your enjoyment of the festival.

Acquiring Lulav and Etrog

The mitsvah of נְטִילַת לולב *netilat lulav* (taking the lulav) requires אַרְבַּעַה מִיָּנִים *arba'ah minnim* (4 species)— לולב *lulav* (palm branch), אֶתְרוֹג *etrog* (citron), הַדַּסִּים *hadassim* (myrtle branches), and עֲרָבוֹת *aravot* (willow branches).

It is considered an act of הַדְדוּר מִצְוָה *hiddur mitsvah* (beautification of the mitsvah) to acquire אַרְבַּעַה מִיָּנִים as fresh and unblemished as available and affordable so that their beauty enhances your enjoyment of the festival.

Eating in the Sukkah

During Sukkot, it is a mitzvah for all eating to be done in the סוכה *sukkah*. (The obligation is suspended in the case of inclement weather.)

- In the סוכה, say the ברכה *berakhah* appropriate for the food. W228 F714
- If you are reciting קידוש *kiddush* or eating a grain product, add the ברכה for dwelling in the סוכה:

ברוך... אשר קדשנו במצותיו וצונו לישב בסוכה.

Barukh... asher kiddeshanu bemitsvotav vetsivanu leshev basukkah.

- If this is your first time this season eating in the סוכה, add:

ברוך... שהחיינו וקימנו והגיענו לזמן הזה.

Barukh... shehehyanu vekiymanu vehiggi'anu lazeman hazeh.

This procedure is usually performed seated to emphasize our "dwelling" in the סוכה.

Some recite אשפזין *ushpizin* upon entering the סוכה each evening. This is an invitation to our revered ancestors to join us in the סוכה as honored "guests." S330

נטילת לולב Netilat Lulav

Each day of Sukkot (except Shabbat), perform the mitzvah of נטילת לולב *netilat lulav* (taking the lulav): S131 W49 F379

- Take the lulav assembly in your right hand, and hold the etrog (stem-end up) in your left hand; reverse hands for left-handed people.
- Hold lulav and etrog together in front of you, and recite the ברכה for נטילת לולב:

ברוך... אשר קדשנו במצותיו וצונו על נטילת לולב.

Barukh... asher kiddeshanu bemitsvotav vetsivanu al netilat lulav.

- If this is your first time this season, add שהחיינו *shehehyanu* (see above).
- Turn the etrog over so that the stem points down.
- Hold lulav and etrog together, and wave the lulav (i.e., extend arms and retract, 3 times) in 6 directions, as follows:
 1. At home, face east; in the synagogue, face the wall holding the ark.
 2. Wave first to the front, then to the right, then to the back, and then to the left, making a clockwise circle.
 3. Wave up (keep lulav vertical), and wave down (lulav remains vertical).

Circling the Sanctuary with Lulav and Etrog

Each day of Sukkot, except Shabbat, a Torah scroll is removed from the ark and held at the reading table. Congregants with lulav and etrog form a procession. This is reminiscent of the processions of the priests around the altar of the Temple in ancient times. The procession:

- Moves counterclockwise around the sanctuary.
- Moves *around* the reading table and the Torah scroll, not in front of them.
- Is accompanied by the recitation of a liturgical poem designated for the day. Each word of the poem (or small groups of words) is preceded and followed by the phrase הוֹשִׁיעָה נָא *hosha na*.

Hosha'na Rabbah

Hosha'na Rabbah, the last day of Sukkot, is the final day of the intense period of reflection and self-evaluation that began on Rosh Hashanah. Traditionally, it is considered the time of the final sealing of God's judgment. Therefore, this day shares some themes of repentance and forgiveness with Yom Kippur. Similar to Yom Kippur, the שליח צבור *sheliah tsibbur* wears a *kittel* (plain white robe) for the מוסף *musaf* service.

The Hosha'na Rabbah service is very complex, combining elements of weekday, festival, and High Holiday services. The נוסח *nusah* (traditional musical chant) for the different sections also reflects the wide range of holiday moods expressed in this service.

A proper נקח *nekach* for each section is noted below this box and on pp. 26–28. For some sections, it is understood that there are differing cantorial traditions.

Hosha'na Prayers and Procession

The procedures are the same as those for the previous days. However, there are 7 Hosha'na prayers and 7 processions. Many congregations remove all the Torah scrolls from the ark at this point.

- The processions are all counterclockwise.
- The processions move *around* the Torah scrolls and the reading table, not in front of them.

Aravot — The 5 Willow Branches

- After the processions, set aside the lulav and etrog.
- Take a bundle of 5 ערבות *aravot* in preparation for beating them.
- Return the Torah scrolls to the ark before beating the ערבות.
- Near the end of this part of the service, beat the willow branches against the floor or other hard surface, stripping off some of the leaves.

Celebrating with the Torah on Simhat Torah

Atta Hor'evta

Whenever we remove the Torah from the ark, we first recite several biblical verses in praise of God. On Simhat Torah we recite a much larger collection of verses, known as **אתה הראת** *atta hor'evta*. S213 F548

- Traditionally, for each verse, a person leads by reciting the verse, and the congregation repeats it.
- In many congregations, various people take turns leading.
- If everyone who desires to lead has not had an opportunity, begin the recitation of the verses again.

Hakkafot

Throughout the year, whenever we read the Torah, the scroll(s) we read from are carried around the sanctuary in procession. On Simhat Torah, both evening and morning, we carry *all* the Torah scrolls in **7 הקפות** *hakkafot* (processions around the sanctuary). These are reminiscent of the processions of the priests around the altar of the Temple in ancient times. Each **הקפה** *hakkafah*:

- Proceeds counterclockwise around the sanctuary.
- Proceeds *around* the reading table, not in front of it.
- Is led by a different member of the congregation.
- Begins with the recitation of one of the 7 assigned liturgical verses, sung phrase by phrase and repeated by the congregation. S214 F550
- Is accompanied by festive singing and dancing.

Reading the Torah on Simḥat Torah Morning

The 1st Scroll: Completing the Reading of the Torah

After the *hakkafot* הקפות are completed, it is traditional for everyone in the congregation to have an *aliyah* from the final *parashah*, וזאת הברכה. The first five readings are read repeatedly until everyone has been called to the Torah. In congregations where *kohen* כהן and *levi* לוי are usually called for the first two *aliyot*, on Simḥat Torah they are called for the opening *aliyot* of each repetition, until they have all been called.

Many congregations conduct simultaneous Torah readings. After everyone has been called to the Torah, the groups combine again into a single congregation. In some congregations people are called to the Torah as families or other small groups. For the last of these *aliyot*, all the children are called to the Torah. They stand under a large *tallit* טלית spread above their heads, as an adult recites the *berakhot* ברכות. Whether there is one Torah reading or several readings at different stations, there must be at all times, at each reading, at least ten people attending to the reading.

The person called for the concluding *aliyah* is named *hatan hatorah* חתן התורה (“groom” of the Torah) or *kallat hatorah* כלת התורה (“bride” of the Torah).

This *parashah* is chanted using the cantillation of the High Holidays. As we complete the reading of the Torah, we complete the holiday season as well.

The 2nd scroll: Beginning the Torah Anew

After we conclude Devarim, we immediately begin again, a symbolic act expressing our continuing dedication to the study of Torah. The person called for the first *aliyah* of Bereshit is named *hatan bereshit* חתן בראשית (“groom” of Bereshit) or *kallat bereshit* כלת בראשית (“bride” of Bereshit).

The congregation participates in the festive reading of this section in two ways.

- The story of each day of creation ends with the refrain . . . ויהי ערב ויהי בקר יום . . . *vayhi erev vayhi voker yom* . . . (“then there was evening, and then there was morning, the 1st [2nd, 3rd . . .] day. For each of the 6 occurrences of the refrain (1:5, 8, 13, 19, 23, and 31), follow this procedure:
 1. At the phrase preceding the refrain, the Torah reader uses a prompting melody to alert the congregation.
 2. When the refrain is reached, the reader pauses.
 3. The congregation recites . . . ויהי ערב ויהי בקר יום, the refrain for that day.
 4. When the congregation has finished, the reader chants the refrain from the Torah using the concluding melody phrase of the Shirat Hayam melody.
 5. The reader continues reading.
- When the reader reaches ויכלו (2:1):
 1. The reader pauses.
 2. The congregations recites the ויכלו passage (2:1–3).
 3. After the congregation finishes, the reader chants the passage.
